5.1.1 English Paper 1 (101/1)

(1) Expect a speech, if not deduct 4 marks

Format (4 marks)

- Title
- A speech is very similar to an essay; it should have an introduction, body and conclusion.
- The introduction should grab the audience's attention and state the focus of the speech/disclosure of topic.
- The conclusion should let the audience know that the speech is over/give the audience something to think about/or call attention to act.
- **Style**: Check for features of spoken language, regular direct address to the audience, use of first person point of view:-

Award as follows:

Title	(1 mark)
Acknowledgements in expected order of hierarchy	(1 mark)
Preliminary (introduction)	(1 mark)
Conclusion	(1 mark)

Content (8 marks)

Language and mechanics of writing

(8 marks)

Descriptions of language at different levels of proficiency are given below. The examiner should place each candidate's work accordingly.

Group D (01 – 02 Marks)

- Candidate does not communicate and their language ability is so minimal that the examiner has to guess what they intended to write.
- Hardly any punctuation marks
- Hardly any correct sentences (construction errors)
- Many spelling errors

Broken usage must be identified to justify the given score.

- Jerky flow-Poor organization of ideas
- Very simple sentences
- All manner of grammatical errors
- Poor use of expressions- misquoted idioms and use of cliches
- Some incorrect punctuation marks
- Some sentence construction errors
- Spelling errors
- Mother tongue intrusion
- Illogicalities
- Style features as indicated in the marking scheme

Group B (05 – 06 Marks)

Communicates fluently, with ease of expression:

- Well-constructed sentences
- Correct punctuation and spellings
- Good use of vocabulary
- Some items of merit (Appropriate register, appropriate expressions, appropriate humour)
- Sentence variety
- Some errors of grammar
- Style features as indicated in the marking scheme
