6. Study the photograph provided and answer question 6(a).

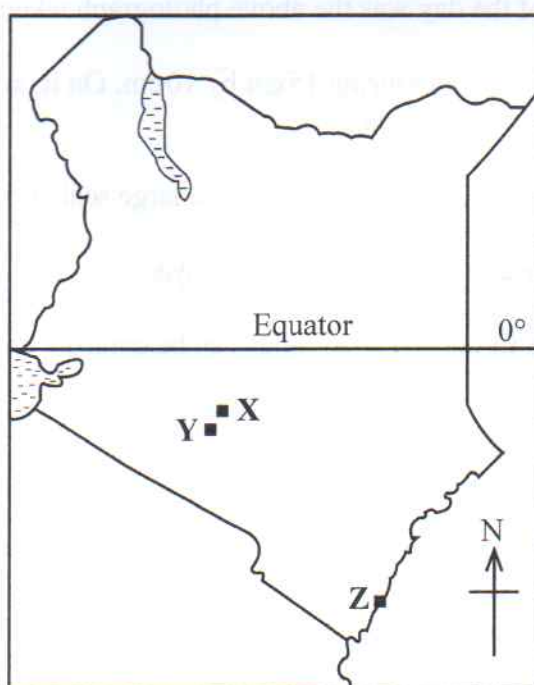


- (a) (i) Identify the type of photograph shown above. (1 mark)
